

Himalayan Adventure – Lahaul & Spiti



Day 1	Company representatives will receive you on arrival at the international airport in Delhi and take you to your hotel.
Day 2	We take you on a tour of Old and New Delhi. As we show you the sights and sounds of this buzzing city with over 17 million residents, you sample street food, visit the presidential residence and heritage monuments of Delhi.
Day 3	We drive 8 hours to reach Simla, the pre-independence summer capital of India. Simla is a pristine hill station located at 6,000 ft. above sea level.
Day 4	We explore the town of Simla. We visit the viceroy lodge, Annandale war museum and the bustling mall road of Simla. We enjoy good food at the Spars lodge in the colonial part of Simla.
Day 5	We move onwards to the Sangla valley. This journey of 7 hours through the lush green hills takes us along the Sutlej river and through some breathtaking roads.
Day 6	We explore the Sangla valley, also known as the Apple Valley of India. We visit Chitkul village (12,000ft.) and enjoy the wilderness.
Day 7	From Sangla, we move onwards to the cold desert of the Spiti valley. The adventurous road journey takes 6 hours. En Route, we visit the Nako lake and Buddhist temples. We halt for the night at Tabo, which is home to the UNESCO world heritage site of the 1100 year old monastery.
Day 8	We start our day by visiting the ancient 100 year old Tabo monastery. Post our visit, we head onwards to Kaza (11,880ft.), the largest town of the Spiti valley. En route, we visit the 800 year old Dhankar monastery. This journey is only 2 hours long. Dhankar, the erstwhile capital of Spiti, is a scenic village situated at an altitude of 3870 m (12,700ft.) above sea level.
Day 9	From Kaza, we head out on a day excursion to Kibber village. Kibber is the highest inhabited village in the world (14,000ft.). Kibber has its own polling station during elections. We also visit the Ki Monastery (built in the 11 th century). It is home to over 250 monks and is located on top of a hill at an altitude of 4,166 metres (13,668 ft).
Day 10	We drive 8 hours to reach Manali – the second largest town in the Kullu valley. En route, we cross the Kunzum Pass (15,147 ft.) and Rohtang pass (13,050ft.). These views along the journey are pristine and breathtaking. We have the evening at leisure to explore the town of Manali, situated at 6500ft. above sea level. Manali was a significant town in the ancient trade route to the kingdoms of the Himalayas.
Day 11	We drive for an hour to the Bhuntar airport and fly onwards to Delhi.
